2	An ordinance of the City of Gainesville, Florida; proposing an amendment to		
4	the Charter Laws of the City of Gainesville; amending Article II of the Charter		
5	Laws, titled "City Commission"; establishing an increase in mayor and		
6	commissioner salaries phased in over five successive years and followed with		
7	annual salary adjustments; providing for submission of the charter amendment		
8	to the voters for approval or disapproval at the November 3, 2020 election;		
9	approving the question to be placed on the ballot; providing that this charter		
10	amendment shall become effective if approved by the voters; providing that		
11	provisions regarding salaries in Chapter 2, Article II, Code of Ordinances are		
12	deleted if the charter amendment is approved; providing directions to the		
13	codifier; providing directions to the clerk of the commission; providing a severability clause; providing a repealing clause; and providing an immediate		
14 15	effective date.

17	WHEREAS, pursuant to 5.01(2) of the City Charter, the City Charter Review Commission		
18	can deliver proposed charter amendments to the City Commission; and		
19	WHEREAS, the City Charter Review Commission held at least 3 public hearings, each at		
20	least 7 calendar days apart, on this amendment, and after which a majority of the full City Charter		
21	Review Commission voted favorably on the proposed amendment; and		
22	WHEREAS, the City Commission duly considered the charter amendment, had the		
23	opportunity to veto the proposed amendment by a two-thirds vote of the City Commission, and		
24	having not vetoed the proposed amendment, by passage of this ordinance, requests the Supervisor		
25	of Elections place the proposed amendment on the next November election ballot, subject to		
26	approval of the electorate at a municipal election; and		
27	WHEREAS, at least 10 days' notice has been given by publication in a newspaper of		
28	general circulation notifying the public of this proposed ordinance and of public hearings in the		
29	Auditorium of City Hall in the City of Gainesville; and		
30	WHEREAS, the public hearings before the City Commission were held pursuant to the		

- published notice described at which hearings the parties in interest and all others had an
- 2 opportunity to be and were, in fact, heard.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY
- 4 OF GAINESVILLE, FLORIDA:
- 5 The following proposed amendment to Chapter 90-394, Laws of Florida, 1990, as
- amended, otherwise known as the Charter Laws of the City of Gainesville, Florida, is approved for
- submission to the electors of the City of Gainesville, Florida, for approval or disapproval at the
- 8 election set for Tuesday, November 3, 2020:

PROPOSED AMENDMENT

- Section 1. 2.12 titled "Salaries" of Article II of the Charter of the City of Gainesville is
- hereby created, which section reads as follows:
- 12 **2.12 Salaries.**

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- (a) Commencing on October 1, 2021 and continuing on October 1, 2022, October 1, 2023,
- October 1, 2024, the annual salary of the mayor will be increased by \$5,268.03 each year,
- until on October 1, 2025 the mayor will receive the annual salary of \$70,550.06.
- (b) Commencing on October 1, 2021 and continuing on October 1, 2022, October 1, 2023,
- October 1, 2024, the annual salary of each other member of the city commission will be
- increased by \$5,162.75 each year, until on October 1, 2025 each other member of the city
- commission will receive the annual salary of \$60,550.07.
- 20 (c) Except as provided in (d) below, on October 1, 2026, the then current annual salary of the
- 21 mayor and each other member of the city commission will be adjusted by the August 2024 to
- August 2025 percent change in the Bureau of Labor Statistics Consumer Price Index, All

- urban consumers, Southern region, All Items (CPI-U). Each year thereafter the salaries will be similarly adjusted, utilizing the following August to August change.
- 3 (d) The salaries will be paid on a biweekly pay cycle from the general fund of the city in equal
- amounts for each biweekly period of service, except for the first and last payment to each
- 5 mayor and other member of the commission that will be made on a pro rata basis. Such salary
- 6 will be calculated from the date the mayor or commissioner, respectively, takes office, and
- will continue until the mayor or commissioner no longer holds such office.
- 8 (e) If employees in the city's professional pay plan do not receive a general increase in any
- 9 particular fiscal year, then the salaries of the mayor and city commissioners will not be
- increased that fiscal year. If payment of a general increase for employees in the city's
- professional pay plan is delayed in any fiscal year, then the mayor and city commissioners
- 12 CPI adjustment will be treated similarly.
 - **Section 2.** If the electors approve the Charter Amendment set forth in Section 1 of this ordinance, then Section 2.66 of Chapter 2, Article II, Code of Ordinances, titled "Salaries" shall be deleted as set forth below.

Sec. 2-66. Salaries.

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17 (a) On June 1, 2000, the then current salary of the mayor and each member of the city commission

18 shall be increased by 1½ percent. Commencing on October 1, 2000, the mayor shall receive the

19 annual salary of \$35,868.00. Commencing on October 1, 2000, each other member of the city

20 commission shall receive the annual salary of \$28,182.00. Except as provided in (c) below on

21 October 1, 2001, the then current annual salary shall be adjusted by the August 2000 to August

22 2001 percent change in the Bureau of Labor Statistics Consumer Price Index (1982-84 = 100)

1	all urban consumers, Southern region, All Items (CPI). Each fiscal year thereafter the salary		
2	shall be similarly adjusted, utilizing the following August to August change. Effective the first		
3	payroll period after March 1, 2002, the then current salaries of the mayor and city		
4	commissioners shall be reduced by 13.14 percent, which reduced salary shall thereafter be		
5	subject to adjustment as provided for herein.		
6	(b) The salaries shall be paid on a biweekly pay cycle from the general fund of the city in equal		
7	amounts for each biweekly period of service, except for the first and last payment that shall be		
8	made on a prorata basis. Such salary shall be calculated from the date the commissioner or		
9	mayor respectively, takes office and shall continue until the mayor or commissioner no longer		
10	holds such office.		
11	(c) If employees in the city's professional pay plan do not receive a general increase in any		
12	particular fiscal year, then the salaries of the mayor and city commissioners shall not be		
13	increased that fiscal year. If payment of a general increase for employees in the city's		
14	professional pay plan is delayed in any fiscal year, then the mayor and city commissioners		
15	CPI adjustment shall be treated similarly.		
16	Section 3. The following ballot title and question is approved for submission to the		
17	electors of the City of Gainesville, Florida, for approval or rejection at the election set for Tuesday,		
18	November 3, 2020:

20	INCREASING MAYOR AND COMMISSIONER SALARIES		
21	"SHALL THE CITY CHARTER BE AMENDED TO INCREASE THE		
22	ANNUAL SALARIES OF THE MAYOR FROM \$44,209.91 TO \$70,550.06 IN		

1	EQUAL INCREMENTS OVER FIVE YEARS FROM 2021 TO 2025 AND		
2	COMMISSIONERS FROM \$34,736.32 TO \$60,550.07 IN EQUAL		
3	INCREMENTS OVER FIVE YEARS FROM 2021 TO 2025, FOLLOWED WITH		
4	AUTOMATIC ANNUAL ADJUSTMENTS BASED ON THE CHANGE IN THE		
5	CONSUMER PRICE INDEX; AS PROPOSED BY ORDINANCE NO?"		
6	Section 4. The Supervisor of Elections is requested to place this ballot title and question		
7	on the November 3, 2020 general election ballot.		
8	Section 5. In the event that the charter amendment proposed by Section 1 of this		
9	Ordinance is approved by affirmative vote of a majority of votes cast by the electors of the City of		
10	Gainesville, Florida at the November 3, 2020 election, then: 1) the codifier is directed to		
11	incorporate the amendments stated in Sections 1 and 2 of this Ordinance in the Charter Laws and		
12	Code of Ordinances of the City of Gainesville; and 2) the Clerk of the Commission is directed to		
13	file a true copy of this ordinance with the Florida Department of State.		
14	Section 6. If any section, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance is held to be invalid		
15	or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, then said holding shall in no way affect		
16	the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance.		
17	Section 7. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are to the extent of		
18	such conflict hereby repealed.		
19	Section 8. This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon final adoption.
