Discussion and Approval of Substantial Amendments to 2018-2022 Consolidated Plan and 2019-2020 Annual Action Plan; and Update to the 2018-2022 Citizen Participation Plan to Facilitate Partial Reallocation of FY 2019-2020 CDBG Program Funding and Allocation of the Additional CDBG Program COVID-19 (CDBG-CV) CARES Act Funds for the Gainesville Cares About Neighbors and Gainesville Cares About Businesses (GNVCares) Initiative (B)

The City Commission is asked to consider and approve the Substantial Amendments to 2018-2022 Consolidated Plan and 2019-2020 Annual Action Plan; and update to the 2018-2022 Citizen Participation Plan to allocate CDBG Program funding to the GNVCares Initiative to provide direct assistance to businesses and neighbors impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic.

Motion

- 1. Approve recommendation as listed on the agenda. Motion passed unanimously.
- Only businesses that have not received Payroll Protection Program funds and/or SBA Disaster Assistance in response to the Coronavirus funds are eligible. Motion passed 6-1. Commissioner Hayes-Santos in dissent.
- This funding should be reimbursed by the State to the City should future funds be allocated from the State to local government for COVID-19 relief. Motion passed 5-2. Mayor-Commissioner Pro Tem Ward and Commissioner Hayes-Santos in dissent.
- 4. There should be an open timeframe for all applications to be received and then evaluated, rather than on a first come, first served basis. Motion passed 4-3. Commissioner Arreola, Mayor-Commissioner Pro Tem Ward and Commissioner Hayes-Santos in dissent.
- 5. Although this will not be used for evaluation purposes, I will ask that this specific data is collected on all applications: 1. Number of people in household 2. Race/Ethnicity 3. Gender 4. Primary and Secondary language 5. Disability status 6. Veteran status. Motion passed 5-2. Commissioner Hayes-Santos and Commissioner Simmons in dissent.
- Demonstrate a strong chance of remaining open post COVID-19.
 The application should include a description of the impact of COVID-19 on the business, and a recovery plan. Motion failed 1-6. Commissioner Johnson affirmative.

- 7. Prioritization of businesses located in a ZIP code with a high poverty rate. Motion failed 1-6. Commissioner Johnson affirmative.
- 8. Operated consistently for two years or more. Motion failed. Commissioner Johnson affirmative.
- 9. Staff work with Human Rights Coalition (HRC) and Rural Women's Health Project to find a way to find funds to work with our undocumented community. Motion passed unanimously.
- 10. Appeal process for businesses. Motion failed 2-5. Mayor Poe and Commissioner Johnson affirmative.
- 11. Change the funding to a 50/50 split between GNV Neighbors and GNV businesses. Motion passed 5-2. Mayor-Commissioner Pro Tem Ward and Commissioner Hayes-Santos voting in dissent.
- 12. Work with the County to find funds within Gainesville Neighbors, if the money is reallocated to find funds to house our homeless population in single room units. Motion passed 4-3. Commissioner Hayes-Santos, Mayor Poe and Mayor-Commissioner Pro Tem Ward in dissent.
- 13. Immigration status or source of income will not disqualify an applicant for receiving city unrestricted funds. Motion passed unanimously.
- 14. All businesses receiving funding should place a GNVCares signage in their window. Motion passed 6-1. Commissioner Arreola in dissent.
- Endorsing the internal application process. Motion passed 4-3.
 Commissioner Arreola, Commissioner Simmons and Commissioner Hayes-Santos in dissent.

Motion by Commissioner Arreola, seconded by Commissioner Hayes-Santos to reconsider Item #12. Motion passed 6-1. Commissioner Johnson in dissent.
