Line 19: Ensure that the development of ADUs does not cause negative impacts on the character or stability of single-family neighborhoods. Ensure that the development of ADUs meets neighborhood design standards.

Line 23: <u>Only One attached</u> ADU <u>and one detached ADU</u> may be permitted per lot or parcel, and ADUs are exempt from residential density calculations.

Line 29: An ADU may not exceed two stories, ADUs must meet accessory structure setbacks. If an ADU exceeds a single-story, the applicant shall take measures to ensure the privacy of neighbors, including orienting windows and outdoor balconies to face internally into the lot and away from neighboring residences.

Line 33: <u>Each allowed ADUs</u>, either attached or detached, may not exceed 850 square feet or up to 50% of the size of the primary structure (not including the garage and unconditioned space), whichever is less. Structures exceeding 850 square feet that existed on February 27, 2020, may be converted into ADUs.

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Line 7: <u>New detached ADU's or ADUs extending from existing</u> <u>structures may not comprise more than 50% of the total visible façade</u> <u>area parallel to the front property line.</u>

Line 11: One parking space per ADU must be provided in addition to

any required parking for the primary unit. However, on-street parking where available may be used to meet ADU parking requirements. It off-street parking is provided, ADUs must be served by the same driveway and the principal building.
