### All City of Gainesville Parks













- One of the only parks in SW Gainesville
- Surrounding area is rapidly developing (Butler Plaza, Celebration Pointe)
- A diversity of housing developments nearby
- Dog park, basketball courts, volleyball courts, pavilions, & 3 full size soccer fields

### New ownership

- Forest Park was recently transferred from Alachua County to City of Gainesville
- This resulted in improvements to field conditions and responsiveness to requests
  - Communication with John Weber
  - Hiring of a new field contractor new sod, consistent mowing
  - Adequate bathroom supplies
  - New signage for GRSL fields
- However, significant needs remain to be addressed





### Safety concerns

- No lightning warning system in place
  - e.g. Thorguard system at Jonesville
  - Places liability of decisions on GRSL personnel
- Players often cross busy 43<sup>rd</sup> Street to chase soccer balls
  - Potential solution: **netting** to prevent balls from rolling into street
- Major need for **field re-grading/re-sodding**:
  - Uneven terrain can cause injuries
  - Insufficient drainage results in dangerous and deteriorating field conditions



#### Field conditions require attention

Bare spots on fields



Broken fencing; field is very close to busy road



#### Insufficient/ minimal seating



Goal areas are completely worn down



### Additional issues to address

- Limited parking capacity
- Lack of shade
- Lack of seating & bleachers for each field
- Limited access to water
- No lighting for evening use
- Bathroom facilities could benefit from renovation



### Additional issues to address

#### Does not meet desired standards of parks in Gainesville.



These improvements fit within a broader vision for recreation in Gainesville

- Additional facilities/fields for soccer
  - Koppers Site Remediation
  - Celebration Pointe Sports Complex
- Building a community
- How can GRSL work with the City of Gainesville to build a "world-class park system"?



#### Recommendations

- Ensure that Forest Park is listed to receive support from Wild Spaces/Public Places this year
  - Obtain 4 votes at March 12<sup>th</sup> meeting
- Advocate for capital improvements and maintenance at Forest Park
  - Continue discussions with city officials
- Find ways to work with the city to achieve broader shared goals
