| 11 | WHEREAS, COVID-19, a respiratory illness caused by a virus that spreads rapidly |
| 12 | from person to person and may result in serious illness or death, constitutes a clear and present |
| 13 | threat to the lives, health, welfare, and safety of the people of the City of the State of Florida, |
| 14 | Alachua County and the City of Gainesville; and, |
| 15 | WHEREAS, on March 1, 2020, Governor DeSantis declared a Public Health |
| 16 | Emergency because of COVID-19; and, on March 9, 2020, Governor DeSantis issued |
| 17 | Executive Order 20-52, declaring a State of Emergency because of COVID-19; and, |
| 18 | WHEREAS, on March 11, 2020, the World Health Organization declared the spread |
| 19 | of COVID-19 to be a global pandemic; and, on March 13, 2020, President Trump declared a |
| 20 | national emergency concerning COVID-19; and, |
| 21 | WHEREAS, County Emergency Order 2020-01 declared a local state of emergency |
| 22 | in Alachua County based on the COVID-19 virus on March 16, 2020; and, |
| 23 | WHEREAS, Subsequent State and County-wide Emergency Orders have been issued |
| 24 | extending the state of emergency and restricting the operation and capacity of bars and |
| 25 | restaurants that serve alcoholic beverages; and, |
| 26 | WHEREAS, City Management and the City Commission are concerned that with the |
| 27 | return of University of Florida students to Gainesville for the Fall 2020 semester, the operating |
| 28 | and capacity restrictions placed on bars and restaurants will drive students to congregate and |

WHEREAS, to address this concern, City Management and the City Commission desire to provide opportunity for all persons to possess and consume alcoholic beverages outdoors on City-owned or operated property (including parks) and public right-of-way throughout the City by temporarily suspending the enforcement (as to personal possession and consumption) of Sec. 4-4 and Sec. 18-20(16) of the City Code of Ordinances; and WHEREAS, this ordinance is intended to be of limited duration during the declared emergency for the COVID-19 Pandemic; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF GAINESVILLE, FLORIDA:

Section 1. The City Manager is directed to cease enforcement of the provisions of Sec. 4-4 and Sec. 18-20(16) of the City Code of Ordinances that prohibit the personal possession and consumption of alcoholic beverages in open containers on City-owned or operated property (including parks) and public right-of-way during the pendency of the COVID-19 Pandemic Emergency Orders issued by the State of Florida and/or Alachua County This ordinance does not suspend or otherwise affect the enforcement of Sec. 4-4 or Sec. 18-20(16) as relates to the sale or distribution of alcoholic beverages on any City-owned or operated property or public right-of-way.

Section 2. In the event that cessation of enforcement as directed by this ordinance creates an immediate public health, safety or welfare concern, the City Commission may repeal this ordinance by adoption of an emergency ordinance by two-thirds vote of the entire City Commission in accordance with Section 166.041(3)(b), Florida Statutes.

Section 3. Given the temporary duration of this ordinance, it is the intent of the
