Introduction

Established in 1960 as an Advisory Board to the City Commission, The City Beautification Board is tasked by Section 2-264 of the city code to "study, investigate, develop, assist, advise and recommend to the city commission any and all matters pertaining to beautification, environment, and citizens' participation relating to same in carrying out its function and duties; the board shall advise and recommend plans to organizations and groups in the city and promote public interest in the general improvement of the appearance of the city".

The Board acts as coordinator, contributor, commentator and catalyst. These efforts are carried out by a committee of enthusiastic citizens and professionals who advise the City Commission on matters pertaining to beautification and the environment, community awareness, and promoting public interest in the improvement of and general appearance of the City of Gainesville.

The purpose of the City Beautification Board is to improve the livability and quality of life in Gainesville and its surrounding areas. The focus of the Board has been to address the environmental and aesthetic concerns of the community by promoting and encouraging: stewardship, improvement and maintenance of community assets, coordinated planning and supportive beautification programs, excellence in design, and opportunities for general public participation in beautification endeavors through gifts, grants, bequests and other contributions for beautification.

Accomplishments/Achievements of 2019 -2020 Projects

The City Beautification Board resumed its **Annual Urban Forestry Workshop** in cooperation with the Tree Advisory Board. The workshop was held on December 4, 2019 at the Ironwood Golf Course. This is a free workshop for the citizens of Gainesville and Alachua County that the CBB has sponsored for many years and has been very well received. Professionals instruct attendees on the latest techniques of urban forestry. Topics covered during the workshop included Palm Diseases: Separating Fact from Fiction, Up and Coming Invasives in North Florida, Utility Vegetation Management with GRU, and Trees as Living Organisms. The workshop also included a planting and root pruning demonstration, an introduction to the City's Urban Forest Management Plan process, and a panel discussion on HB1159. Attendees were eligible to receive up to five Continuing Education Unit (CEU) credits for attending. Approximately 75 citizens attended this event.

The **annual Arbor Day Celebration** was hosted on January 17, 2020, at Depot Park. The City of Gainesville planted 72 shade trees in honor of Arbor Day - two shade trees were planted for each year as a Tree City, USA. Approximately 100 to 150 citizens attended this event, and Commissioner Harvey Ward read the Arbor Day Proclamation to the audience at the ceremony. The CBB, in partnership with the Urban Forestry department, also hosted their first tree giveaway of 100 3-gallon live oaks and redbuds, along with instructional posters on proper tree planting and care.

The CBB typically hosts an **Annual Awards Program** in April of each year at the Thomas Center in the Long Gallery and the Spanish Court. The awards highlight projects of outstanding aesthetic and artistic appeal. Projects are evaluated for originality, innovation and creativity, as well as for their sustainability, maintenance and use of serviceable materials. An award-winning site must exhibit appropriate land utilization, effective planning, compatibility with the area and screening of unsightly views. All projects must meet applicable building and landscaping codes. Each must result in the improvement of the area, property, or neighborhood. Unfortunately, due to COVID-19, the 2020 awards program was canceled. The awards have been delivered to all the winning projects, and the CBB plans to recognize these projects at the 2021 ceremony.

In 2020, 24 awards were presented to the winners in 12 categories.

Projects Planned for FY 2020 - 2021

The CBB will continue to monitor the situation with COVID-19 to determine the best way to proceed regarding the **Annual Urban Forestry Workshop**, which is normally held the first week of December. The Tree Advisory Board has expressed interest in collaborating with the CBB again for the workshop.

Annual Arbor Day Celebration - The 2021 Arbor Day program will be presented on January 15, 2021. The location and format of the event is to be determined. Seventy-four shade trees will be planted by the City.

Annual Awards Program - The tentative date for the Annual CBB Awards Program is April 28, 2021. The projects awarded in 2020 will also be recognized at this event.
