The urban forest should...


- 1) Predominantly reflect diversity of surrounding native forest

- 3) Include woodlands, parks, old trees that reflect historic character of the region, tree-lined roadways, individual trees, & understory vegetation
- 4) Support a mutually enhancing relationship between natural & built environment
- 5) Citizens & government should be educated about urban forest & its benefits
- 6) Bring beauty, interest, and calming atmosphere to urban environment
- 7) Support Gainesville communities' values & unique character

#### **HUMAN HEALTH**

**Objective:** No net loss of human health benefits from the urban as defined by the EPA health benefits model used within the i-Tree analysis program (Strategic Framework 3 b).

1. Calculate the distance and travel time to parks (Arc-GIS, spatial analyst).

2. Develop Citywide strategic plan for acquisition and development of parks, greenways and trails to ensure equitable accessibility.
