#### **Recommended Action:**

Discuss uniform regulatory approach to pedestrian safety in the right-of-way

#### Prior Board Motions:

On January 23, 2018, the County adopted ordinance 18-06, attached, establishing a vehicle pedestrian interaction code that regulated certain conduct between individuals occupying a portion of the public street and individuals in vehicles. The intent of the ordinance was the protect the public health, safety, and welfare by preventing these interactions due to the inherently dangerous nature of them, as well as the negative impact that pedestrians interacting with vehicles has on the flow of traffic on public streets.

### Background:

The City of Gainesville and the County currently have separate and distinct approaches to regulating pedestrian safety. The County adopted an ordinance regulating interactions between pedestrians and vehicles in 2018. That ordinance does not apply in the City of Gainesville and the City has recently been discussing its own regulatory approach.

The City Attorney has presented at least one regulatory concept to the City Commission. Depending on the options presented by the City, the County may want to adopt the same or similar code for purposes of uniformity between the jurisdictions.

19	WHEREAS, Chapter 125, Florida Statutes, provides the Alachua County Board of
20	County Commissioners with broad authority to enact ordinances and prescribe penalties for
21	violations of those ordinances; and
22	WHEREAS, interactions between pedestrians and vehicles pose a safety risk to drivers,
23	pedestrians, and bystanders; and,
24	WHEREAS, distracted driving is a public safety concern due to its effect on traffic
25	patterns as well as its potential to cause traffic accidents; and
26	WHEREAS, between January 2012 and May 2017, there were 687 vehicle crashes
27	involving pedestrians in Alachua County, including 21 crashes with traffic fatalities; and
28	WHEREAS, regulating interactions between pedestrians and vehicles will benefit the
29	health, safety, and welfare of the residents of Alachua County by reducing traffic crashes
30	involving both vehicles and pedestrians and reducing traffic fatalities.
31	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT DULY ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY
32	COMMISSIONERS OF ALACHUA COUNTY, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

Chapter 117 Ordinance - FINAL 01/23/2018

1	SECTION 1. The Board of County Commissioners finds and declares that all statements
2	in the preamble of the ordinance are true and correct.
3	SECTION 2. Chapter 117, entitled "Miscellaneous Offenses" of the Code of Alachua
4	County, Florida is hereby amended as follows:
5	Sec. 117.02 - Interactions Between Pedestrians and Vehicles Prohibited
6	(a) <u>Definitions</u>
7	Whenever used herein, the following terms and phrases shall have the following
8 9	meanings, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:
10	(1) "Public street" means that portion of a road or street improved, designed, or
11	ordinarily used for vehicular traffic on any road or street dedicated to the
12	public for use by vehicular traffic;
13	(2) <u>"Traffic median" means any area on a public street that separates opposing</u>
14	lanes of traffic, including, but not limited to, grassed areas, raised concrete
15	areas, or painted areas;
16	(3) "Vehicle" means every device in, upon, or by which any person or property is,
17	or may be, transported upon a public street, bicycle path or lane, or entrance
18	or exit ramp of interstate highways, including, but not limited to, cars, trucks,
19	semi-trucks, vans, buses, motorcycles, mopeds, bicycles, and scooters.
20	sonn naeks, vans, buses, neteregetes, mepeus, oregetes, and seboters.
21	(b) No person shall occupy a traffic median, bicycle path or lane, entrance or exit ramp of
22	interstate highways, or public street and interact with, or invite interaction between,
23	that person and an operator or occupant of any vehicle. This provision shall not apply
24	to persons occupying sidewalks.

26	(c) No person operating or occupying a vehicle on a public street, bicycle path or lane, or
27	entrance or exit ramp of interstate highways shall interact with, or invite interaction
28	between, that operator or occupant of the vehicle and any pedestrian.
29	
30	SECTION 3. Repealing Clause. All ordinances or portions thereof in conflict herewith
31	are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby repealed.
32	SECTION 4. Modification. It is the intent of the Board of County Commissioners that
33	the provisions of this ordinance may be modified as a result of considerations that may arise
34	during public hearings. Such modifications shall be incorporated into the final version of the
35	ordinance adopted by the Board and filed by the Clerk to the Board.

1	SECTION 5. Severability. If any word, phrase, clause, paragraph, section or provision of
2	this ordinance or the application hereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid or
3	unconstitutional, such finding shall not affect the other provisions or applications of the
4	ordinance which can be given effect without the invalid or unconstitutional provisions or
5	application, and to this end the provisions of this ordinance are declared severable.
6	SECTION 6. Inclusion in the Code. It is the intent of the Board of County
7	Commissioners of Alachua County, Florida, and it is hereby provided that the provisions of this
8	ordinance shall become and be made a part of the Code of Ordinances of Alachua County,
9	Florida; that the section of this ordinance may be renumbered or re-lettered to accomplish such
10	intent and that the word "ordinance" may be changed to "section", "article", or other appropriate
11	designation.
12	SECTION 7. Effective Date. A certified copy of this ordinance shall be filed with the
13	Department of State by the Clerk of the Board within ten (10) days after enactment by the
14	Board and shall take effect upon filing with the Department of State.
