8 9	WHEREAS, the Municipal Home Rule Powers Act, Chapter 166, Florida Statutes, secures for								
10	municipalities the broad exercise of home rule powers granted by Article VIII, Section 2 of the								
11	Florida Constitution, including the exercise of any power for municipal purposes not expressly								
12	prohibited by law; and								
13	WHEREAS, Sections 163.3167 and 163.3177(1), Florida Statutes, requires the City of Gainesville								
14	to maintain a Comprehensive Plan to guide the future development and growth of the city by								
15	providing the principles, guidelines, standards, and strategies for the orderly and balanced future								
16	economic, social, physical, environmental, and fiscal development of the city; and								
17	WHEREAS, the City of Gainesville is required by Section 163.3202, Florida Statutes, to adopt or								
18	amend and enforce land development regulations that are consistent with and implement the								
19	Comprehensive Plan, and that are combined and compiled into a single land development code								
20	for the city (the City of Gainesville's Land Development Code is Chapter 30 of the Code of								
21	Ordinances); and								
22	WHEREAS, this ordinance, which was noticed as required by law, will amend the text of the Land								
23	Development Code as described herein; and								

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1	WHEREAS, the City Plan Board, which acts pursuant to the authority granted in Section 4.02 of
2	the Charter Laws of the City of Gainesville and which acts as the Local Planning Agency pursuant
3	to Section 163.3174, Florida Statutes, held a public hearing on August 27, 2020, and voted to
4	recommend the City Commission approve this text change to the Land Development Code; and
5	WHEREAS, at least ten days' notice has been given once by publication in a newspaper of general
6	circulation notifying the public of this proposed ordinance and of public hearings before the City
7	Commission of the City of Gainesville; and
8	WHEREAS, public hearings were held pursuant to the notice described above at which hearings
9	the parties in interest and all others had an opportunity to be and were, in fact, heard; and
10	WHEREAS, the City Commission finds that the Land Development Code text amendment
11	described herein is consistent with the City of Gainesville Comprehensive Plan.
12	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF GAINESVILLE,
13	FLORIDA:
14	SECTION 1. Section 30-2.1 of the Land Development Code is amended as follows. Except as
15	amended herein, the remainder of Section 30-2.1 remains in full force and effect.

16 Section 30-2.1 Definitions.

Attached dwelling means two or more dwelling units that are attached horizontally, where each unit has its own front yard and direct entrance from the ground level. This term includes, but is not limited to: two-family dwellings, three-family dwellings, and four-family dwellings; townhouses and rowhouses, and dwelling units that may be on one combined lot or individual lots.

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- 1 **Two-family dwelling** means a building containing two dwelling units, configured either 2 horizontally or vertically. Two-family dwellings are considered multiple-family dwellings, and this
- 3 definition excludes accessory dwelling units as defined in the Land Development Code.

- 5 **SECTION 2.** Section 30-4.16 of the Land Development Code is amended as follows. Except as
- 6 amended herein, the remainder of Section 30-4.16 remains in full force and effect.

- $5 \underline{6}$ = Except where the units are separated by a common wall on the property line of two adjoining lots. In such instances, only the side yard setback for the end unit is required.
- 6 <u>7</u> = Accessory pre-engineered or pre-manufactured structures of 100 square feet or less and
 one story in height may be erected in the rear or side yard as long as the structure has a
 minimum yard setback of three feet from the rear or side property line, is properly anchored to
 the ground, and is separated from neighboring properties by a fence or wall that is at least 75
 percent opaque.
- 10 $7 \underline{8}$ = Accessory screened enclosure structures, whether or not attached to the principal
- 11 structure, may be erected in the rear yard as long as the enclosure has a minimum yard setback
- 12 of three feet from the rear property line. The maximum height of the enclosure at the setback
- 13 line shall not exceed eight feet. The roof and all sides of the enclosure not attached to the
- 14 principal structure shall be made of screening material.
- 15 SECTION 43. It is the intent of the City Commission that the provisions of Sections 1 through $\frac{32}{2}$
- 16 of this ordinance become and be made a part of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Gainesville,
- 17 Florida, and that the sections and paragraphs of the Code of Ordinances may be renumbered or
- 18 relettered in order to accomplish such intent.
- 19 SECTION 54. If any word, phrase, clause, paragraph, section, or provision of this ordinance or the
- 20 application hereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid or unconstitutional, such finding
- 21 will not affect the other provisions or applications of this ordinance that can be given effect
- 22 without the invalid or unconstitutional provision or application, and to this end the provisions of
- 23 this ordinance are declared severable.
- 24 **SECTION <u>45</u>**. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are to the extent of such
- conflict hereby repealed.
- 26 **SECTION** $\neq \underline{6}$. This ordinance will become effective immediately upon adoption.
