Manager's Updates: Recreation Division- January 2021

I. Sports Section (Aquatics & Athletics)

- 1. Attendance at city pools for the month of January was 4,534. Recreational swim has still not been allowed, and lap swim and teams are the only users at this time due to COVID-19 restrictions.
- 2. **High School water polo season** began January 11. Practices for GHS and BHS (new this year) are being held at Hunter pool.
- 3. The **PVC vinyl pool liner replacement at Mickle Pool** project is in full swing and is expected to be finished by March 3rd.
- 4. The shade structures at Cherry Pool bid, has been awarded to Creative Shade Solutions. They are currently working on a permitting plan.
- 5. **H. Spurgeon Cherry Pool House renovation** designs are moving along well with expected renovations occurring fall/winter 2021.
- 6. **Pickle Ball:** Pick-up play continues in the spring at the MLK Center, in the mornings.
- 7. **Citywide Tennis Services:** USTA-FL staff continues to set programming and add events and activities to their website. For court reservations, program information, and other general information, patrons can visit <u>www.playtennisgainesville.com</u>.
- 8. Youth Basketball is halfway through their season, ending February 27. We are restricting spectators at MLK to 1 parent per athlete to keep the capacity of MLK under 50 at this time due to COVID-19 restrictions. We have successfully started live streaming the games on Youtube.
- **9. Adult Softball** began February 1st. We have modified some rules and not permitting use of the dugouts to afford space for social distancing. First games with the new rules have gone well, and participants are glad to have softball back up and running.
- 10. Gainesville Youth Sports: Information on the spring season can be found at <u>www.gainesvilleyouthsports.com</u>. Gainesville Youth Sports provides both youth baseball and girls fast-pitch softball programs, utilizing Albert Ray Massey Park, Greentree Park, and Tom Petty Park. The park improvement project at Albert Ray Massey (Westside) Park to improve drainage around the ball fields is nearly complete. The fields affected by the project are open and ready for use.

ARM: Out of School Day (Jan. 29) at Albert "Ray" Massey; there were 11 total enrolled, the fill rate was 36%.

ESRC: Out of School Day (Jan. 29) at Eastside was cancelled due to low enrollment. Registration was closed on January 27, 2021.

6. Programming: Foundations Academy After-School Program.

The Foundations Academy After-School Program resumed on January 4, 2021 from a hiatus which began on December 18, 2020 in conjunction with the ACPS Winter Holidays period.

-A partnership with The Florida Museum of Natural History expanded to Eastside for their "Science Surprises" program. After-school participants explore the science of nature while having fun with physics, chemistry, and engineering by engaging in hands-on, inquiry based activities. The program is structured as a 4-part series (each session is approximately 30-60 minutes) and includes a train-the-trainer model for Education Section staff before each session allowing for on-site support during activities while instruction is conducted virtually by The Florida Museum of Natural History staff.

III. Facilities Section

- 1. The MLK Multipurpose Center is currently open for Pickleball and open gym. Most days Pickleball players are active and show up during the open court times of 7am- 10am. - 2. We are currently reviewing applications and will start interviewing the week of February 8.
- 3. We have worked with other city and county departments to administer Covid vaccines at the MLK location. There has been good cooperation and successful days during the vaccination times. We are looking forward to the other opportunities to come together with others in efforts of providing a much needed public service.
- 4. There has been some usage on fields from community user groups starting back the play of youth an adult sports. They are all required to submit safety plans regarding their focus on reducing the transmission of Covid 19. Most users has been understanding and providing the requested information.
- 5. Overall, the facilities section is working well within the current COVID restrictions. Staff is doing their part in practicing being safe and ensuring that safety standards are being followed. I am very proud of the work they have done and continue to do under the current circumstances.
