10 11	WHEREAS, the City has long had a police advisory council (created and appointed by
12	City management) that received feed-back from the community concerning public safety issues
13	and law enforcement needs and actions, provided advice to the City Manager and Chief of Police
14	on the provision of public safety services and facilitated the flow of ideas and information
15	relative to public safety services for the continued improvement of the quality of life of
16	Gainesville residents; and
17	WHEREAS, on June 22, 2020, the City Commission moved to expand the role of the
18	existing police advisory council and to have it appointed by and report directly to the City
19	Commission; and
20	WHEREAS, this ordinance creates the Police Advisory Council within the City Code of
21	Ordinances as an advisory body that is appointed by and reports to the City Commission; and
22	WHEREAS, at least 10 days' notice has been given once by publication in a newspaper
23	of general circulation notifying the public of this proposed ordinance and of public hearings to be
24	held in the City Commission Auditorium, City Hall, City of Gainesville; and
25	WHEREAS, the Public Hearings were held pursuant to the published notice described at
26 27	which hearings the parties in interest and all others had an opportunity to be and were, in fact
28 29	heard.

1	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE
2	CITY OF GAINESVILLE, FLORIDA:
3	Section 1. A new Division 4. titled "Police Advisory Council" within Article V of
4	Chapter 2 of the City Code of Ordinances is created to read as set forth below.
5	Chapter 2 – ADMINISTRATION
6	ARTICLE V. – BOARDS, COMMISSIONS AND COMMITTEES
7	DIVISION 4. – POLICE ADVISORY COUNCIL
8	Sec. 2-301. – Intent and purpose.
9	It is the intent of the city commission to create, empower, staff, and fund a police advisory
10	council whose purpose is to study the city's police department, gather information, receive
11	community input concerning public safety issues and law enforcement needs and concerns,
12	and make policy recommendations to the city regarding all aspects of the delivery of public
13	safety services with the goal of maintaining a safe city that enjoys a strong, positive and
14	trusting relationship between the community and the city police department.
15 16	Sec. 2-302. – Advisory board.
17	The police advisory council (the "council") is hereby created as an advisory board to advise
18	the city commission, city manager and the chief of police regarding all matters of public
19	safety services and community law enforcement needs and concerns as more fully described
20	<u>in sec. 2-305.</u>
21 22 23	Sec. 2-303. – Appointment of members; terms; officers; no compensation; attendance; removal; procedural rules.
24	(a) Appointment. The city commission shall appoint eleven members to the council. It is
25	desired that the members be reflective of the racial, age, socio-economic and geographic

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.1.	diversity of the city. All members permanent residence snall be within the municipal
2	corporate limits of the City of Gainesville, Florida. Current employees of the city's
3	police department are not eligible to serve on the council.
4	(b) Terms.
5	(1) Each member shall be appointed to a 4-year term. However, to establish staggered
6	terms, 3 initial appointees shall be appointed to a 2-year term, 4 initial appointees
7	shall be appointed to a 3-year term and 4 initial appointees shall be appointed to a 4-
8	year term.
9	(2) Members may be reappointed for consecutive terms. A member may remain on the
10	council until a successor has been appointed; however, the successor will serve only
11	the remaining term of that seat in order to preserve the staggered terms.
12	(3) When a seat becomes vacant before the end of that seat's term, the city commission
13	shall may appoint a substitute member to fill the vacancy for the duration of that
14	seat's term.
15	(c) Officers. The council shall annually elect a chair and vice-chair from among its
16	membership.
17	(d) Compensation; expenses. The members of the council shall not be deemed employees of
18	the city, nor entitled to compensation, pension, or other benefits on account of service on
19	the council. Council members may be reimbursed for mileage, travel and any other such
20	expenses incurred on council business from funds budgeted by the city commission and
21	expended pursuant to city financial policies and procedures.

1	(e) Attendance. Council members are required to attend all regular and special meetings of
2	the council. Each council member may be granted four excused absences per calendar
3	year. Each council member shall notify the council clerk of an absence prior to the
4	meeting, if practicable.
5	(f) Removal. A member may be removed from the council with or without cause by the city
6	commission.
7	(g) Rules of procedure and meetings.
8	(1) The council shall adopt rules of procedure to govern the conduct of its meetings and
9	carry out its purposes. All rules must conform to this code and state law and must be
10	approved by the city commission and approved as to form and legality by the city
11	attorney.
12	(2) The council shall meet at least once each calendar month, unless cancelled by the
13	council or its chair. The council may meet more often at the call of the chair or the
14	city commission.
15	(3) A quorum shall consist of a majority of the voting members of the council; however,
16	a smaller number may adjourn a meeting. Official action may only be taken by
17	majority vote when a quorum is present.
18	(4) The council and its members are subject to the applicable provisions of Florida's
19	Government in the Sunshine Law (Section 286.012, Florida Statutes), Florida's Code
20	of Ethics for Public Officers and Employees (Chapter 112, Part III, Florida Statutes),
21	and Florida's Public Records Law (Ch. 119, Florida Statutes), all as may be amended
22	from time to time.

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To assist each member in gaining a fundamental understanding of the police department 4 and public safety services, the city will give, or arrange for, training in the following areas within 5 one year of each member's appointment: organizational structure, communications, facilities 6 and equipment, the internal affairs process, the hiring process, community policing and information led policing, and high liability areas. Additional training will be provided on an asneeded or as-requested basis.

9 Sec. 2-305. – Authority, functions and duties of the police advisory council.

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The council shall make independent recommendations regarding all aspects of public safety to the city commission, the city manager and the chief of police. The functions and duties of the council include, but are not limited to:

- (a) Review how existing police operations and procedures affect communities and individuals of color, especially black residents, as well as other historically and currently marginalized communities and individuals:
- (b) Consider what, if any, current police department programs, functions and practices should be ended, are having a positive impact and should be better-supported or might best be delivered by a different existing city department.
- (c) Offer proposals for reform as clear, stand-alone modules that consider logistical and funding concerns, with special attention to how they affect communities and individuals of color, in particular black residents, as well as other historically and currently marginalized communities and individuals.

1	(d) Serve as a panel to review closed cases of use of force, internal investigations against
2	police officers and/or complaints against the department with the purpose being to make
3	recommendations on controls, processes and/or systems that should be considered in
4	order to prevent the occurrence of future issues.
5	(e) Host summits on police transformation.
6	(f) Study increasing the use of police service technicians and renaming the program
7	"community service technicians" to have more non-weaponized officers respond to calls.
8	(g) Assist in generating community interest and involvement in crime prevention, to include
9	community oriented policing and other areas of community relations and distribution of
10	material on crime deterrence; and
11	(h) Review and make recommendations concerning such other matters as may be referred to
12	the council from time to time by the city commission, city manager and/or chief of
13	police.
14	The council does not have the authority to direct the city commission, the city manager, the chief
15	of police or any other city employee to take or not take any action.
16 17	Sec. 2-306. – Work plan; reports; referrals.
18	The council shall develop its goals and priorities each year and recommend such annually in the
19	form of a work plan for consideration and approval by the city commission. At the end of each
20	quarter of the fiscal year (January 1, April 1, July 1), the council shall provide a report to the city
21	commission on the activities of the council during that quarter. The city commission, city
22	manager and/or chief of police may refer issues, questions of interests, or areas of study to the

council. Upon receipt of the referral, the council shall meet, review, prioritize and study the

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1	referred issue and shall subsequently provide a recommendation to the city commission, city
2	manager and/or chief of police as soon as practicable.
3	Sec. 2-307. – Council member guidelines.
4 5	Council members are is expected to actively engage in the collection and evaluation of
6	information related to the provision of police and public safety services. Council members shall
7	conduct research, gather information and learn from the experiences of industry experts and
8	other councils/boards/committees from throughout the country in order to make informed and
9	independent recommendations to the city commission, the city manager and/or the chief of
10	police.
11 12	Sec. 2-308 City resources.
13	(a) The council may request information from the city manager and other city charter
14	officers as necessary. At the direction of the city charter officers, city staff shall prepare
15	such reports, analysis, and recommendations as are reasonably requested by the council
16	to allow it to carry out its functions and duties as set forth in this division.
17	(b) The city attorney, or designee, shall serve as legal advisor to the council.
18	(c) The city manager, or designee, shall designate a staff member to serve as clerk to the
19	council. The clerk may prepare an agenda, shall prepare minutes of each council meeting
20	and shall work with the clerk of the commission to properly notice each meeting and
21	retain records in the city's legislative system.
22	Secs. 2-309—2-320 Reserved.
23 24	Section 2. It is the intention of the City Commission that the provisions of Section 1 of
25	this Ordinance shall become and be made a part of the Code of Ordinances of the City of

1	Gainesville, Florida, and that the sections and paragraphs of this Ordinance may be renumbered
2	or relettered in order to accomplish such intentions.
3	Section 3. If any word, phrase, clause, paragraph, section or provision of this ordinance
4	or the application hereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid or unconstitutional, such
5	finding shall not affect the other provisions or application of the ordinance which can be given
6	effect without the invalid or unconstitutional provisions or application, and to this end the
7	provisions of this ordinance are declared severable.
8	Section 4. All ordinances or parts of ordinances, in conflict herewith are to the extent of
9	such conflict hereby repealed.
10 11	Section 5. This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon final adoption.
