Purpose: The City of Gainesville is soliciting proposals from qualified and experienced firms to provide annual consulting services in, but not limited to, forecasting and financial services on an as needed basis. As work is needed to be performed by the contractor, task orders will be generated for the specific requirements needed. The selected firm will be expected to perform such services as assistance in forecasting and financial planning as well as other tasks as may be deemed necessary by the City.

Funds: General, Special and Enterprise

Scope of Services:

The following is a description of the scope of services, which may be required by the City:

- Develop ten-year expense and revenue forecasting model for all funds with ability to create scenario based comparisons in order to identify short-term and long-term impacts of financial decisions, provide a framework for scenario evaluation and sensitivity tests, and consider future cost requirements/events to ensure financial sustainability.
 - Factors for evaluation include, but are not limited to: millage rate, property tax growth, fire assessment, inter local agreements, state revenue sharing estimates, annual required pension contributions, collective bargaining agreements, capital investments including renewal and replacement, general fund transfers (GRU), debt service obligations, CPI, and maintaining reserve requirements.
 - Ability to interface with City's financial system of record.
- Annually, or as required, review and make recommendations on forecasting (quarterly or semiannual basis)
- Annually, or as required, provide assistance in development of ordinances and resolutions, bulk service agreements, and development agreements and inter-local agreements between the City and other public agencies.
- Participate in periodic meetings and formal presentations including project progress reviews, formal City Commission presentations and public hearings.

Data sources for models:

- Current year all funds operating budget
- Upcoming fiscal year preliminary budget
- Impacts of unexpected events (ex: pandemic)
- Forecast assumptions provided by Budget
