Section 5. That this Commission supports and promotes that all persons, regardless of

80 where they were born, have basic human rights and fundamental freedoms, and that it is all 81 governments' and citizens' moral obligation to recognize and respect these rights and freedoms.

82 Section 6. That this Commission, along with the citizens of Gainesville, Florida, rededicate
83 themselves to the prevention of mass atrocities such as genocide and crimes against humanity and
84 to the basic principles of justice, fairness, and empathy that all persons are entitled to.
