

RESOLUTION NO. 210165

A resolution of the City Commission of the City of Gainesville, Florida; relating to the levy of general municipal purpose Ad Valorem Taxes for the 2021-2022 fiscal year beginning October 1, 2021 and ending September 30, 2022; establishing a proposed Millage Rate; computing the rolled back rate; setting a public hearing; providing for notice to the Alachua County Property Appraiser; and providing an immediate effective date.

**WHEREAS**, the Alachua County Property Appraiser certified the 2021 taxable values to the City Commission of the City of Gainesville, Florida on June 21, 2021.

**WHEREAS**, the gross taxable value for operating purposes not exempt from taxation within Alachua County has been certified by the County Property Appraiser to the City of Gainesville as \$8,132,378,247.

**WHEREAS**, Section 200.065, Florida Statutes, requires the City Commission to advise the Property Appraiser of its rolled-back millage rate, its proposed millage rate, and of the time, date, and place at which a public hearing will be held to consider the proposed millage rate and the proposed tentative budget.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF GAINESVILLE, FLORIDA:**

**Section 1.** The proposed millage rate necessary to fund the proposed tentative general purpose municipal budget for the City of Gainesville's 2021-2022 fiscal year is 5.2974.

**Section 2.** The FY 2021-2022 proposed operating millage rate is 5.2974 mills, which is greater than the rolled-back rate of 5.1487 mills by 2.89%.

1           **Section 3.** A public hearing will be held to consider the proposed millage rate and the  
2 tentative budget for general municipal purposes on Thursday, September 13, 2021, at six o'clock  
3 p.m., or as soon thereafter as the matter may be heard, in the City Hall Auditorium on the first  
4 floor of City Hall, 200 East University Avenue, City of Gainesville, Florida.

5           **Section 4.** The City Manager is hereby authorized and directed to provide a copy of this  
6 resolution to the Alachua County Property Appraiser for use in preparing the Notice of Proposed  
7 Property Taxes, as required by Section 200.069, Florida Statutes, and to execute, as the  
8 Administering Official, any Department of Revenue forms necessary to complete this certification.

9           **Section 4.** This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.
