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4	A resolution of the City Commission of the City of
5	Gainesville, Florida; relating to the levy of general
6	municipal purpose Ad Valorem Taxes for the 2021-2022
7 8	fiscal year beginning October 1, 2021 and ending September 30, 2022; establishing a proposed Millage Rate;
9	computing the rolled back rate; setting a public hearing;
10	providing for notice to the Alachua County Property
11	Appraiser; and providing an immediate effective date.
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13 14	WHEREAS, the Alachua County Property Appraiser certified the 2021 taxable values to
15	the City Commission of the City of Gainesville, Florida on June 21, 2021.
16	WHEREAS, the gross taxable value for operating purposes not exempt from taxation
17	within Alachua County has been certified by the County Property Appraiser to the City of
18	Gainesville as \$8,132,378,247.
19	WHEREAS, Section 200.065, Florida Statutes, requires the City Commission to advise
20	the Property Appraiser of its rolled-back millage rate, its proposed millage rate, and of the time,
21	date, and place at which a public hearing will be held to consider the proposed millage rate and
22	the proposed tentative budget.
23	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION
24	OF THE CITY OF GAINESVILLE, FLORIDA:
25	Section 1. The proposed millage rate necessary to fund the proposed tentative general
26	purpose municipal budget for the City of Gainesville's 2021-2022 fiscal year is 5.2974.
27	Section 2. The FY 2021-2022 proposed operating millage rate is 5.2974 mills, which is
28	greater than the rolled-back rate of 5.1487 mills by 2.89%.
29	

Section 3. A public hearing will be held to consider the proposed millage rate and the
tentative budget for general municipal purposes on Thursday, September 13, 2021, at six o'clock
p.m., or as soon thereafter as the matter may be heard, in the City Hall Auditorium on the first
floor of City Hall, 200 East University Avenue, City of Gainesville, Florida.
Section 4. The City Manager is hereby authorized and directed to provide a copy of this
resolution to the Alachua County Property Appraiser for use in preparing the Notice of Proposed
Property Taxes, as required by Section 200.069, Florida Statutes, and to execute, as the
Administering Official, any Department of Revenue forms necessary to complete this certification.
Section 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.
