Manager's Updates: Recreation Division-June 2021

I. Sports Section (Aquatics & Athletics)

- 1. Attendance at city pools for the month of May was 6,624. Recreational swim is slowly being introduced on the weekends at Hunter and Mickle pools. Memorial Day was our first weekend at limited capacities.
- 2. Splashpads at Cherry and Hunter pools are under contract for pump replacements as well as other preventative maintenance.
- 3. H. Spurgeon Cherry Pool House renovation designs are moving along well with expected renovations occurring November 2021.
- 4. **H. Spurgeon Cherry Pool** parking lot and pool liner have been added to the WSPP list for next fiscal year. We are currently working on the scope for the pool liner so it can go out to bid soon.
- 5. 9 staff from Aquatics are currently in the middle of a Water Safety Instructor training. They will received their certifications mid-June.
- 6. Pickle Ball: Pick-up play continues in the spring at the MLK Center, in the mornings.
- 7. **Citywide Tennis Services:** USTA-FL staff continues to set programming and add events and activities to their website. For court reservations, program information, and other general information, patrons can visit <u>www.playtennisgainesville.com</u>.
- 8. **Summer Heatwave** has started the process of background checking coaches and registering participants. We have confirmed use of Lincoln Middle School gym for the summer and have pool party dates set. Games began June 21 at MLK and Lincoln gym.
- 9. **Pop Warner Football and Cheer** registration is open. We are excited about the upcoming season. We are offering football and cheer ages 5-12.
- 10. Adult Softball summer league started May 17. We have 11 teams on Tuesdays and 8 teams on Fridays.
- 11. Gainesville Youth Sports: Information on the spring season can be found at <u>www.gainesvilleyouthsports.com</u>. Gainesville Youth Sports provides both youth baseball and girls fast-pitch softball programs, utilizing Albert Ray Massey Park, Greentree Park, and Tom Petty Park.
- 12. National Flag Football: Ended another season May 23 at Possum Creek park. They had 106 participants.

II. Education Section - MAY

1. Staffing Report.

Chanton Williams separated employment with the City effective June 5, 2021 creating a second vacancy for Recreation Aide II.

In total, there are four vacancies in the Education Section, a Recreation Leader position, two Recreation Aide II positions, and a Temporary Recreation Assistant position. The job advertisement for both the Recreation Leader and Recreation Aide II vacancies closed on May 16, 2021 (the existing job advertisement and subsequent interviews will be used to fill the second vacancy created by Chanton Williams separation).
