

# Proposed Parking Fee Changes

Gainesville City Commission July 12, 2021

### Overview

Proposal to adjust parking fees based on data and multiple parking studies to improve parking system management. To include:

- Hourly parking rate structure
- Neighborhood parking permit rate and zone structure
- Parking enforcement hours extended
- Location of paid and free parking
- Demand management pricing

### Improved Parking Management Addresses

City's 2021 Community Survey #2 mobility priority

Make it easier to find public parking

Top Priority City goal for Vision Zero

- Increase pedestrian and bicycle safety
- Reduce travel speeds

High Priority City goal for Climate Change reducing:

- Circling for a parking space
- Vehicle GHG emissions
- Traffic congestion

### Hourly Parking

- Simpler rate structure, time limits and types of available parking allows for more efficient curb management while increasing the availability of parking to better serve neighbors and businesses in adjacent areas
- Current rates vary from \$0.25 to \$0.50/hour
- Chaotic free spaces; paid spaces on and off-street; varied time limits
- Garage parking monthly, quarterly and annual rates will remain unchanged
- Rates were last increased 17 years ago in 2004
- Potential increase in revenue approximately \$225,000/year


## **Hourly Parking**

#### Current



#### Black = paid (time limit varies); Red = neighborhood permit required; Dark Green = time limited / 2 hr; Light Green = Free, no restrictions; Blue = off-street parking

#### **Proposed**



**Black** = paid parking (convert all to \$1.00/hr, max 2 hr); **Red** = neighborhood permit required; **Pink** = convert to paid parking (\$0.50/hr max 2 hr); **Yellow** = paid parking (convert all to \$0.50/hr, max 4 hr); **Light Green** = Free, no restrictions; **[PG]** = Garage (convert to \$0.50 per hour, 24 hr); **[1]** = Surface lots (convert to \$0.50/hr; max 4 hr)

#### PROPOSED ADJUSTMENTS:


- Convert high demand spaces to paid 2 hour spaces at *up to* \$1.00 / hour
- Convert off-street surface lots to 4 hour limit
- Reduce garage rate to \$0.50 / hour

### **Neighborhood Parking**


- Current zone structure = 11 parking zones
- Proposed zone structure = 6 zones

#### **PERMIT / SPACE RATIO**

During FY21 program year a total of 2,573 permits were issued; 2,405 spaces available.



Merged Zones plus New Spaces Ratio



Proposed changes include merging permit zones north of UF campus and east of 13<sup>th</sup> Street; plus adding 169 on-street parking spaces on SW 6<sup>th</sup> Street as part of a Vision Zero project to slow traffic speeds and provide a key connection in the bicycle network.


### **Neighborhood Parking**

- Merging zones nearest UF campus would allow better use of available spaces
- Current permit rates significantly lower when compared to market rates
