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#### TECHNICAL PROPOSAL

Braswell Law, PLLC submits this application for the Code Enforcement Special

Magistrate position on behalf of its owner, Jefferson M. Braswell. As stated above, he has

served in this capacity for more than 5 years. His primary focus as the code enforcement

magistrate is provide adequate due process to all citizens that may appear before him. Although

the Florida Rules of Evidence are relaxed for citizen participation, it is clear that the hearing

should be conducted consistent with the Rules of Evidence and the fundamental principles of due

process giving all citizens an opportunity to be heard and all witnesses to be fully examined.

Providing citizens with the opportunity to be heard in each case is the cornerstone of the work.

Based on experience with conducting the hearings, many of the respondents have received previous warnings concerning their failure to comply with the orders of enforcement officers, so it is fundamental to the job to work with the staff and with the property owners in order to effect compliance. This can and should include a number of alternative methods depending on the property owner including the use of fines, variable fines depending on progress, additional opportunities to make progress with frequent reports back to the hearing officer, and suspended fines providing additional time for compliance. Based on years of experience and working with staff and the City Commission, the ultimate goal is to get the properties cleaned up to a point that they are no longer a nuisance to their neighbors, communities, and to the city and that they are no longer detrimental to the fabric of the neighborhoods.

Mr. Braswell is a solo practitioner. Mr. Braswell's practice is a highly diverse practice which primarily focuses on contract litigation including disputes concerning the development and

construction of homes and commercial properties. Mr. Braswell has an extensive administrative law practice with cases before the Florida Department of Environmental Protection, Florida Department of Revenue, and the Department of Business and Professional Regulation. Mr. Braswell also enjoys a diverse local government practice and frequently appears before local city commissions and the Alachua County Commission on comprehensive plan amendments and zoning applications. ## PRICE PROPOSAL




