Land Registry of Protected Public Places – Ordinance #080576

Ordinance #080576 States

- A registry will be created for the purpose of identifying fee-simple properties owned by COG that are deemed to be worthy of the highest level of protection.
- When listed, properties may not be sold or converted to a use that will result in a loss of value for which the property was placed on the registry, except by a majority vote of the electors.

 City Commission approved amendment

March 24, 2009
 COG citizens voted in favor of amendment on

Staff developed a phased listing plan.


- Phase I:

Land Registry of Protected Public Places – Ordinance #080576

- January 31, 2011
- RCAPW Committee recommended Phase I listing to City Commission.
- March 3, 2011
- City Commission recommended 11 Phase 1 properties placed on the Registry.
- June 16, 2011
- Ordinance #100967 placing the recommended 11 Phase 1 properties on the Registry was approved on first reading
- July 7, 2011
- Adopted on final reading.



Phase II-A property listing Ordinance #121080

March 21, 2013

City Commission recommended Phase II-A properties be placed on the Registry.

June 6, 2013

Ordinance #121080 placing Phase II-A properties on the Registry passed on first reading

June 20, 2013

Passed and adopted



Phase II-B (pending):

 Proposes 4 additional nature parks will be added once land use/zoning or recreational development issues have been resolved.



Proposed:

- 1. 34th Street property, NW 34th St
- 2. Colclough Pond Nature Park, 2315 S Main St
- 3. Loblolly Woods Nature Park, 3315 NW 5th Ave
- Terwilliger Pond Conservation Area, 460 SW 62nd Blvd



34th Street property

Confirmed with Land Rights Coordinator - this property is managed by PRCA. Considered a conservation area and has no access for the public.

Colclough Pond Nature Park
 No issues at this time.




- Loblolly Woods Nature Park
 - Rezoning/land use to conservation will need to be completed on some of the parcels.
 - ACT inholding will not be included in listing description.

- Terwilliger Pond Conservation Area
 - Needs land use and zoning change.

Future:

- 3. Cone Park SW Properties
- 4. Duval Park
- 5. Green Acres Park (+new additions)
- 6. Morningside Additions (Crawford + DOC)
- 7. Palm Point Nature Park (+Franklin parcels)
- 8. Possum Creek Park.



- Phase III Properties
 - Flatwoods Conservation Area
 - Gum Root Park
 - Wacahoota
- May or may not be listed in future depending on specific issue needing to be resolved



Recommendation:

Provide a recommendation to the City
 Commission to proceed with listing the four properties proposed for Phase II-B on the Registry of Protected Public Places.
