I. Sports Section (Aquatics & Athletics)

- 1. Attendance at city pools for the month of August was 7,052 Recreational swim is available by appointment at Hunter and Mickle pools.
- 2. Splashpads at Cherry and Hunter pools are under contract for pump replacements as well as other preventative maintenance.
- 3. H. Spurgeon Cherry Pool House renovation designs are moving along well with expected renovations occurring November 2021.
- 4. **H. Spurgeon Cherry Pool** parking lot and pool liner have been added to the WSPP list for next fiscal year. We are currently working with a leak detection company in order to have pertinent information for prospective bidders for the liner project.
- 5. **47 more participants** took swim lessons at the City pools this Fall. We were able to offer 1 fourweek sessions this fall. This will be the last session until the Spring.
- 6. Pickle Ball: Pick-up play continues in the spring at the MLK Center, in the mornings.
- 7. **Citywide Tennis Services:** USTA-FL staff continues to set programming and add events and activities to their website. For court reservations, program information, and other general information, patrons can visit <u>www.playtennisgainesville.com</u>.
- 8. **Pop Warner Football and Cheer** has begun. We have **3** cheer teams and **3** football teams practicing and we are looking forward to our first game September 11. We look forward to a great season.

- 10. Adult Softball Fall league begins September 20 and runs through December 13.

1. Staffing Report.

- 1. We are currently prepared to start interviews shortly to fill several vacancies in our section that are temp. Facility assistants. We are looking forward to hiring someone that will be ready and able to assist us at that position as soon as possible.

Current Projects:

Dwight H. Hunter Women's Locker Room Improvements: Work is underway renovating the women's locker room at Dwight H. Hunter (Northeast) Pool. Bolt Electric Contractors, Inc. is installing new lights and McLeod General Trades, LLC is installing new restroom partitions. The work began in August and is anticipated to complete by the end of September 2021. The construction project cost is approximately \$11,721.45. Loblolly Woods Park Boardwalk Reconstruction: Work is underway to reconstruct the boardwalk at Loblolly Woods Nature Park, spanning from NW 8th Avenue approximately 1400 feet north. The boardwalk has been closed to the public since August 2020. Severe wood rot created a safety hazard that was beyond the capacity of City staff to repair. The City of Gainesville's Parks, Recreation and Cultural Affairs Department, working in partnership with the Wild Spaces & Public Places program, hired IMS Contracting, Inc. to reconstruct the boardwalks. The work began on August 23, 2021 and is anticipated to complete by February of 2022. The construction project cost is approximately \$370,287.
