Manager's Updates: Recreation Division-September 2021

I. Sports Section (Aquatics & Athletics)

- 1. Attendance at city pools for the month of September was 7,428. Recreational swim is available by appointment at Hunter and Mickle pools.
- 2. Splashpads at Cherry and Hunter pools are under contract for pump replacements as well as other preventative maintenance.
- 3. H. Spurgeon Cherry Pool House renovation designs have gone out to bid, expected renovations occurring soon.
- 4. **H. Spurgeon Cherry Pool** parking lot and pool liner have been added to the WSPP list for next fiscal year. We are currently working with a pool company to revise the scope of work in order to include new gutters and returns after finding leaks in the system this summer.
- 5. **320 participants** took swim lessons at the City pools this year. We are looking forward to beginning swim lessons again in April 2022.
- 6. Pickle Ball: Pick-up play continues in the spring at the MLK Center, in the mornings.
- 7. **Citywide Tennis Services:** USTA-FL staff continues to set programming and add events and activities to their website. For court reservations, program information, and other general information, patrons can visit <u>www.playtennisgainesville.com</u>.
- 8. **Pop Warner Football and Cheer** has begun. We have **3** cheer teams and **3** football teams practicing. We had our first home game on Oct 2 and it went well.
- 9. Youth Basketball registration opened for neighbors and community builders on October 1. Registration for non-residents will open on October 11.
- 10. Adult Softball Fall league began September 21 and will run through December 13. We have 12 teams on Tuesday and 10 teams on Fridays.
- 11. Gainesville Youth Sports: Information on the fall season can be found at <u>www.gainesvilleyouthsports.com</u>. Gainesville Youth Sports provides both youth baseball and girls fast-pitch softball programs, utilizing Albert Ray Massey Park, Greentree Park, and Tom Petty Park.
- **12.** National Flag Football: Registration is still open for another flag football season at Possum Creek Park. Flyers went to schools and the season is anticipated to begin October 17.

ARM & ESRC: The Out of School Days programming, offered at both Albert "Ray" Massey Recreation Center and Eastside Community Center, opened enrollment June 1 and will operate on the following dates:

Out of School Days provide children and youth in grades 1 through 8 with a safe and engaging environment that incorporates hands-on activities. Activities will effectively adapt to individual and small group needs, connecting with participants' interests and experiences including: academics and enrichment, community service projects, field trips, physical activity and nutrition.

5. Programming: Start Smart Basketball.

MLK: Start Smart Basketball at Martin Luther King Jr. opened enrollment September 1 and will operate October 25 through November 29 on Mondays from 6:30 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. for a total of 6 sessions. A total of 20 enrollment slots are available, 17 participants are currently enrolled.

Start Smart Basketball is a developmentally appropriate introductory sport specific program that prepares children 3-5 years old and their parents for organized sports in a fun non-threatening environment. Parent participation was required.

III. Facilities Section

- 1. We completed the interviews for the temp. Facility assistants. No candidates were selected and we are seeking to re advertise for the position.
- 2. We are continuing to work with organizations on reinstating there long term rentals, as well as new organizations that maybe interested in helping provide needed services to the public.
- 3. We are currently receiving requests weekly for the use of facilities to host repasses for passing family members. We have been doing a great job of being able to address the needs of the neighbors and ensuring the availability of a facility for use during these times.
- 4. The facility staff has been doing an exceptional job. Their ability to remain professional in tough situations, all while providing a safe environment for our patrons, shows the pride they have in their jobs.

Current Projects:

Ironwood Golf Course Cart Path Reconstruction: Work is anticipated to begin in mid-October to reconstruct portions of the Ironwood Golf Course concrete cart path. The City of Gainesville's Parks, Recreation and Cultural Affairs Department, working in partnership with the Wild Spaces & Public Places program, hired Shine & Company, Inc. to perform the work. The project is anticipated to complete by mid-December 2021. The golf course will remain open during construction and golfers will be guided around the areas of work. Loblolly Woods Park Boardwalk Reconstruction: Work is underway to reconstruct the boardwalk at Loblolly Woods Nature Park, spanning from NW 8th Avenue approximately 1400 feet north. The boardwalk has been closed to the public since August 2020. Severe wood rot created a safety hazard that was beyond the capacity of City staff to repair. The City of Gainesville's Parks, Recreation and Cultural Affairs Department, working in partnership with the Wild Spaces & Public Places program, hired IMS Contracting, Inc. to reconstruct the boardwalks. The work began on August 23, 2021 and is anticipated to complete by February of 2022. The construction project cost is approximately \$370,287.
