Manager's Updates: Recreation Division- October, 2021

I. Sports Section (Aquatics & Athletics)

- 1. Attendance at city pools for the month of September was 7,438. Recreational swim is available by appointment at Hunter and Mickle pools.
- 2. **Splashpads at Cherry and Hunter pools** are still under contract for pump replacements as well as other preventative maintenance.
- 3. **H. Spurgeon Cherry Pool House renovation** designs have gone out to bid, expected renovations occurring soon.
- 4. **H. Spurgeon Cherry Pool** parking lot and pool liner have been added to the WSPP list for this fiscal year. We are currently working with a pool company to revise the scope of work in order to include new gutters and returns after finding leaks in the system this summer.
- 5. **Pickle Ball:** Pick-up play continues in the spring at the MLK Center, in the mornings.
- 6. **Citywide Tennis Services:** USTA-FL staff continues to set programming and add events and activities to their website. For court reservations, program information, and other general information, patrons can visit www.playtennisgainesville.com.
- 7. **Pop Warner Football and Cheer** is coming toward the end of the season. We have **2** cheer teams and **2** football teams still participating. **2** cheer teams have qualified for regionals held thanksgiving weekend and our 8U and 12U football teams have won the league championship and begin regional playoffs in Palatka on November 6.
- 8. **Youth Basketball** registration is currently open. Registration ends November 29. Practice begins the week of December 13 and games begin January 8.
- 9. **Adult Softball** Fall league is beyond the halfway point of the regular season. It is expected to run through December 13. We have 12 teams on Tuesdays and 10 teams on Fridays.
- 10. Gainesville Youth Sports: Information on the fall season can be found at www.gainesvilleyouthsports.com. Gainesville Youth Sports provides both youth baseball and girls fast-pitch softball programs, utilizing Albert Ray Massey Park, Greentree Park, and Tom Petty Park.
- **11. National Flag Football:** Another flag football season has begun at Possum Creek Park on October 17.

II. Education Section - OCTOBER

1. Staffing Report.

Johnathan Williams joined the team as a new hire, filling a vacancy for a Recreation Aide II, on October 11, 2021.

4. Programming: Start Smart Sports Development Program (preschool)

In total, 46 out of 50 spots filled this year over 3 sports offerings (baseball, soccer, and basketball - 9 waitlisted). Of the 46 enrollments, 27 were unique customers, of which 16 were boys and 11 were girls. Total net revenue generated was \$2,250.00 (baseball - \$450.00, soccer - \$742.50, and basketball - \$1,057.50). Due to the overwhelming positive response, we will continue the 3 sports offerings annually until evaluation and feedback indicates negative or non-responsiveness.

Start Smart Sports Development Program was developed by top motor skill development specialists in the field of youth sports. Parent-child groups perform motor skill tasks that gradually build confidence in children while they are having fun at the same time.

Start Smart participants will develop proper motor skills without the threat of competition or the fear of getting hurt that will allow them to enjoy and succeed in their youth sports future!

III. Facilities Section

- 1. We completed the interviews for the temp. Facility assistants. No candidates were selected and we are seeking to re advertise for the position.
- 2. We are continuing to work with organizations on reinstating there long term rentals, as well as new organizations that maybe interested in helping provide needed services to the public.
- 3. We are currently receiving requests weekly for the use of facilities to host repasses for passing family members. We have been doing a great job of being able to address the needs of the neighbors and ensuring the availability of a facility for use during these times.
- 4. The facility staff has been doing an exceptional job. Their ability to remain professional in tough situations, all while providing a safe environment for our patrons, shows the pride they have in their jobs.

Current Projects:

Ironwood Golf Course Cart Path Reconstruction: Work began on October 19th to reconstruct portions of the Ironwood Golf Course concrete cart path. The City of Gainesville's Parks, Recreation and Cultural Affairs Department, working in partnership with the Wild Spaces & Public Places program, hired Shine & Company, Inc. to perform the work. The project is anticipated to complete by mid-December 2021. The golf course will remain open during construction and golfers will be guided around the areas of work. Loblolly Woods Park Boardwalk Reconstruction: Work is underway to reconstruct the boardwalk at Loblolly Woods Nature Park, spanning from NW 8th Avenue approximately 1400 feet north. The boardwalk has been closed to the public since August 2020. Severe wood rot created a safety hazard that was beyond the capacity of City staff to repair. The City of Gainesville's Parks, Recreation and Cultural Affairs Department, working in partnership with the Wild Spaces & Public Places program, hired IMS Contracting, Inc. to reconstruct the boardwalks. The work began on August 23, 2021 and is anticipated to complete by February of 2022. The construction project cost is approximately \$370,287. Howard Bishop Recreation Area: The City of Gainesville's Wild Spaces & Public Places program, in conjunction with the Parks, Recreation and Cultural Affairs Department and in partnership with the School Board of Alachua County, is pleased to announce that renovations of the track and tennis/basketball courts at Howard Bishop Middle School, located at 1901 NE 9th St., began in June and are anticipated to complete by mid-November 2021. D.E. Scorpio Corporation, a local business, is the general contractor for the project. The City of Gainesville's portion of the construction project cost is \$250,000. The construction project cost is \$2,292,276.00 and work is anticipated to complete in March of 2022.
