### 110282. Game Day Parking Regulations (B)

This item was introduced by Planning & Development Services Director Erik Bredfeldt, and the Committee heard from Senior Assistant City Attorney Nicolle Shalley.

The Committee discussed the issue at length and received input from stakeholders on both sides of the issue. After hearing the concerns of stakeholders and staff, the Committee directed staff to pare down the list of conditions to the minimum necessary to address key neighborhood concerns, while still allowing for this limited activity on the days designated by the City Manager.

The key elements of the Committee's direction to staff was to: require a special event permit instead of a business license; require the property owner's authorization for the activity; require a parking plan indicating that the parking area is located on private property; and provide procedures for revocation of a permit.

MOTION: A motion was made by Commissioner Wells, seconded by Commissioner Hinson-Rawls to accept the staff recommendation with modifications. Motion passed unanimously.

#### RECOMMENDATION

Direct staff to bring Petition No. PB-11-92TCH, as revised by the Community Development Committee to the City Commission for a petition hearing and contact all stakeholders regarding the proposed process.

## 110779. Agricultural Uses in Residential Districts (B)

Planning & Development Services Director, Erik Bredfeldt, gave an overview of this item. The Committee received input from citizens regarding urban agriculture. One of the main concerns centered around the limit on the number of fowl allowed to be kept in the City. After hearing the concerns of stakeholders and staff, the Committee directed staff to come back within 60 days with more information on several issues including:

1) The pros and cons of increasing the number of fowl allowed, and whether or not other nuisance issues (such as smell, etc.) could be used to regulate potential problems.

- 2) Ideas on how this could be regulated based on acreage/lot size or set-backs
- 3) What other communities are doing related to this issue
- 4) What other food producing animals (besides chickens) should the Committee consider and discuss
- 5) Adding a new Strategic Initiative for Sustainable Issues and/or Plans

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>

The Community Development Committee hear a presentation from staff on this issue and provide direction as appropriate.
