Resolution for Amendment to the Traffic Signal Maintenance and Compensation Agreement with FDOT (B)

This item is a request to amend the Florida Department of Transportation Traffic Signal Maintenance and Compensation Agreement.

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) currently compensates the City of Gainesville for maintenance of Intelligent Transportation System (ITS) infrastructure along the State Highway System (SHS). This includes traffic signals, school beacons, blank out signs, travel time detector, within city limits. This increase in compensation reflects new state FY19/20 rates.

The Florida Department of Transportation compensates the City annually for Traffic Signal Maintenance. The amount to be reimbursed for State FY19/20 is \$694,452.00. Last State FY18-19, the reimbursement amount was \$676,020.00. The 2.7265% reimbursement increase is due to the increase reimbursement rates for Traffic Signals and Intelligent Transportation System devices.

The City Commission: 1) adopt the Resolution for an Amendment to the Traffic Signal Maintenance and Compensation Agreement with the Florida Department of Transportation; and, 2) authorize the City Manager to execute all necessary documents, subject to approval by the City Attorney as to form and legality.
