Ordinance No. 0-98-87

An ordinance of the City of Gainesville, Florida, amending section 26-46 of the code of ordinances relating to vehicle owner's liability for illegal parking, clarifying the procedure for notification of owner and payment of fees; allowing collection activity by an agency designated by the city manager and allowing the city to provide a list of owners with three or more outstanding parking violations to the state; providing directions to the codifier; providing a severability clause; providing a repealing clause; and providing an immediate effective date.

At its meeting on August 10, 1998, the City Commission authorized the City Attorney to draft and the Clerk to advertise an ordinance proposing to clarify the processes involved in the review of contested citations and collection of parking fines.

The City Manager is requesting certain changes as shown in his memorandum to further clarify when fees are due.

The City Commission: (1) hear proposed amendments to the ordinance by the City Manager; and (2) adopt the proposed ordinance (as amended).
