**Second Quarter Amendment through March 31, 2020 to the FY 2020 General Government Financial and Operating Plan Budget(B)**

**Resolution No. 191155**

A Resolution of the City Commission of the City of Gainesville, Florida; relating to its general government budget for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2019 and ending September 30, 2020; amending Resolution No. 190397, as amended by resolution No. 190880, by making certain adjustments to the General Government Financial and Operating Plan Budget; and providing an immediate effective date.

The purpose of this amendment is to accurately reflect and incorporate into the City’s FY 2020 General Government budget those transactions and activities that were not anticipated during the budget process.

All of the recommended changes are funded either by increases in revenue budgets, decreases in expenditure budgets, or decreases in appropriate fund balances.
