AMENDMENT TO ELECTIONS CODE RELATING TO THE DESIGNATION OF THE REGISTRATION AND QUALIFYING OFFICER (B)

Ordinance No. 160740

An ordinance of the City of Gainesville, Florida, amending Chapter 9 of the Code of Ordinances relating to elections; amending Section 9-6 as it relates to the designation of the registration and qualifying officer; providing directions to the codifier; providing a severability clause; providing a repealing clause; and providing an effective date.

The City Commission adopt the proposed ordinance.

The City Commission at its meeting of February 16, 2017 approved the Interlocal Agreement for Election Services. The Agreement provides that the Clerk of the Commission is designated as the registration and qualifying officer for City elections. This amendment addresses this provision of the Agreement and also provides that the City may contract with the Supervisor of Elections to take back these duties. This ordinance requires two hearings and shall become effective immediately upon adoption.
